following information:

Has there been any enquiry or investigation done that the polymer / plastic note paper that is being imported is free from Tallow which is derived from animal rendered fat from Beef and Mutton ?.

2) Kindly clarify the ingredients of Polymer paper that has been projected to be import against the above tender.

3) As in India, using notes made of Cow fat will be against religious sentiments of most of the population, how will the sentiments of the population be protected.

4) Further, the Hon'ble Prime Minister has publicly proclaimed that all bank notes should be manufactured in India and we should not rely on imports. When the government is pushing the Make in India concept for the benefit of economy and self reliance, will this concept of importing polymer currency notes, compromising the self reliance and costing foreign exchange to the exchequer be justified?

APPENDIX

- This RTI is pertaining to the import of Polymer / Plastic note paper against tender no. PQB/GT/PLASTIC/CO/01/2016-17 DT. 29 ARPIL 2016
- II. The RBI has publically announced that they would be introducing Plastic notes of Rs. 10 denomination and trials would be conducted in a few States within India.
- III. The Bank of England which recently introduced £5 plastic notes has confirmed that the polymer pellets from which the base substrate is made, contains a substance known as tallow. Tallow is derived from animal rendered fat from Beef and Mutton.
- IV. The Bank of Canada has also confirmed that its plastic notes contain substance that is derived from animal fat.
- V. One of the suppliers of polymer substrate namely Innovia, have themselves confirmed that their products are produced from tallow, that is derived from animal rendered fat from Beef and Mutton.
- VI. The Hindu Council, U.K. approached the Bank of England to confirm this news and the Bank of England confirmed that the £5 plastic notes indeed contain a substance known as tallow, which is derived from animal rendered fat from Beef and Mutton.
- VII. The Hindu Council informed the Government of U.K. that this would be unacceptable to millions of Hindus, Sikhs, Jains etc. and others in the U.K. The Bank of England invited the members of the Hindu Council for a meeting and has confirmed that they have duly noted the concerns and have assured the concerns of the Hindu Community are being taken with utmost seriousness.

Mr. Henry Smith who chairs the all party parliamentary group on animal welfare, has strongly condemned the use of plastic notes derived from animal products and has advised the Bank of England to find alternative ways. Mr. Damian Hinds from the conservative party and Ms. Angela Rayner from the labour party have also reacted.

The Hindu Council in U.K. has confirmed that the Bank of England would hold the issue of further denomination of plastic notes, until a full consultation has been done.

- VIII. We are a Country which welcomes all religions and allows every citizen to practice their faith of choice and it is not in the Nations interest to isolate their own citizens by issuing plastic notes which contain Beef tallow and leads to anger among several communities in India.
 - IX. Consumption of beef is highly conflicting to Hindu beliefs and it is certainly banned from entering Hindu religious centers. Cow, the seat of many deities, is sacred and has long been venerated in Hinduism.
